A Century-long Legacy of **Educational Impact**

As a first generation college student, Kelly Gray believed education was a key to a brighter future. She just wasn't sure where the money for school would come from.

It was her guidance counselor at Mapleton who encouraged Gray to apply for a Hess Loan when she graduated high school in 1981. The funding helped Gray complete her three-year nursing program at Mansfield General Hospital School of Nursing.

Each spring, Gray recalls, it was the Hess dollars that helped her to pay second semester tuition, finish the year and stay in school.

This was exactly what Dr. Gilbert Hess had in mind when he established a \$100,000 trust fund through his will for the purpose of providing local students with educational

Hess was a veterinary surgeon and pharmacist who became widely known as the founder of Hess & Clark, an Ashland-based stock food manufacturing company that was the largest of its kind in the world.

Reporting in the local newspaper upon Hess's death in 1923 indicates that locally, he was equally well-known as a philanthropist.

"His heart was quick to respond to calls of need," the article read. "Great numbers will rise up to call him

blessed. Quietly and unostentatiously his helpful spirit found expressing in noble deeds."

Now, 100 years after Hess's death, these loans have helped hundreds of students fulfill their educational ambitions.

Like all Hess loans, Gray's was interestfree while she was in school, as well as the first year after graduation.



"I actually was able to pay it all back before the deadline, so I didn't accrue any interest," Gray said. "I don't think it was until after graduation that I realized what a blessing that

Gray paid off her loans while working as a night shift nurse at Samaritan Hospital. She went on to advance in both her education and her career, earning a doctoral degree in nursing and working her way up to vice president at North Central State College.

In her work at NCSC, Gray has directed many students to the Hess loan program. She has seen the power those loans have to change the trajectories of students' lives.

"Without that loan opportunity, there are students who would probably walk away from school," she said. "It's so exciting that someone who sought so long ago to make a difference was able to impact hundreds of students, and each of them has impacted hundreds more lives with their education.

"That's the excitement of philanthropy. You don't have to have a million dollars. You just have to have a heart and a vision."

For the past 25 years, Ashland County Community Foundation has managed the Hess Loan fund. The loan fund is overseen by Educational Programs Director, Lanie Hartge, and our Educational Programs Committee.

Applications for Hess Loans are accepted three times annually, with deadlines November 1, February 28 and June 15. The applicant's household net worth must be less than \$250,000, the applicant must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher and the applicant must live in Ashland County or have graduated from an Ashland County high school or home school. Investing in Tomorrow's Leaders

We recently awarded 299 scholarships totaling \$463,930 to students across the region. This was a record year for our scholarship program with the largest number of scholarships awarded to date, thanks to the generosity of caring donors in our community. Notably, we awarded 36 scholarships from a new fund created through the generous estate plan of Ashland native and Savannah resident Warren Applegate, a U.S. Marine veteran and computer programmer who valued education and wanted to help local students succeed. 




